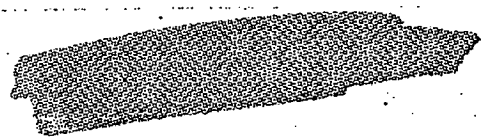

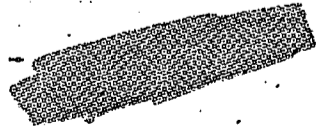

[REDACTED] claimed that although JUAN MARI BRAS is [REDACTED] *connected* his, he has had very little association with him down through the years. [REDACTED] he has had only two personal contacts with JUAN MARI BRAS and both in the nature of casual meetings in restaurants. [REDACTED] Prior to 1950, he last saw MARI BRAS in [REDACTED] when MARI BRAS visited [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] explained that the Independentista Party, with which, he understands, MARI BRAS is now affiliated, was formed as a result of a collusion between some of the members of the Popular Party and some of the NPPR members. [REDACTED] claims that MARI BRAS had Nationalistic sympathies prior to the formation of the Independentista Party, giving as his reason that prior to the formation of the Independentista Party in Puerto Rico, there was only one party in Puerto Rico in favor of independence, namely the NPPR.

[REDACTED] claimed that JUAN MARI BRAS for several years has been very strongly in favor of independence for Puerto Rico and principally for this reason believes he has had Nationalistic sympathies. For the same reason, it is [REDACTED] belief that MARI BRAS'S father probably had NPPR sympathies.
