


The Bureau concurs with you that the refusal of the Committee of 24 of the United Nations to take up the so-called colonial status of Puerto Rico offers an excellent opportunity to utilize a counterintelligence measure to discredit the leaders of the independence movement and particularly Juan Mari It appears, however, that your proposed anonymous letter as it stands might provoke Mari Bras into taking violent action to overcome this defeat in the eyes of his followers.

It might be desirable to blame the communist bloc and particularly Cuba for the failure in the United Nations and to criticize Mari Bras and the others for isolating the Puerto Rican independence forces from the democratic countries. This would imply that Mari Bras erred in aligning the Movimiento Pro Independencia de Puerto Rico with the communist countries but would not directly attack his leadership.

Your comments concerning the above are solicited. you concur with the above, submit a proposed letter for anonymous mailing in line with the Bureau's observations.

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

MPIFR announced that a writ of habeas corpus would be submitted by him and fellow attorney LEN WOLT asking for a retrial on grounds that "The four were denied their civil and constitutional rights."

The four prisoners referred to are RAFAEL CANCEL, IRVING FLORES, ANDRES RIGUEROA CORDERO, USA and LOLITA SEPRON, all serving life terms in the United States penitentiaries.

JUAN MARI BRAS is the Interim Secretary General of the MPIPR who is presently a member of the MPIPR General Assembly and leader of the Unity Commission.



JUAN MARI BRAS added that the "tremendous amount of adverse coverage given them in Washington, New York, and the rest of the country made it impossible for them to have a fair and impartial trial."

JUAN MARI BRAS further stated that the four nationalists in prison for the 1954 shooting are also eligible for parole, "but they refused to apply for it. They are not interested in paroles or pardons, but in a fair and impartial trial."

JUAN MARI BRAS stated that the appeal began three months ago when the four wrote to him asking if he would represent them. He said that this would be the first appeal made by the four, but they could give no reason why they have not filed an earlier appeal.

PLEBISCITE IN PUERTO RICO

July 23 Referendum

The inhabitants of the Island of Puerto Rico are scheduled to go to the polls next July 23 to express their desires on the future political status of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico. They will have a choice among three recommendations: (1) to retain commonwealth status with the United States; (2) to become the 51st state of the Union; or (3) to become, with the consent of the United States Congress, an independent country. Opponents of the plebiscite contend, however, that the options are not that simple. The most important among those opposing the plebiscite are the violence-prone supporters of independence, who realize that their cause has little-chance of success on July 23.

A Capsule History

Puerto Rico was discovered by Christopher Columbus in November. 1493. It remained under Spanish rule until occupied by American troops during the Spanish-American War, and it was granted to the United States in 1899 by the Treaty of Paris. The so-called Jones Act, which became effective in March, 1917, conferred United States citizenship on Puerto Ricans. Relations between the mainland and the island passed through gradual steps to the Elective Governor Act of 1947, which granted the Governor full power to appoint all officials except an auditor. Luis Munoz-Marin was elected Governor, held that position until he turned it over to Roberto Sanchez Vilella in 1964, and is still leader of the Popular Democratic Party. In 1948, that Party had proposed a commonwealth status with a separate constitution. Despite opposition by statehood advocates who insisted that it was a move toward separation and by independence supporters who argued that it was merely another example of colonial subservience, the 80th Congress adopted the proposal by passing Public Law 600. In a July 4, 1951, referendum, the voters of Puerto Rico gave, in fact, their consent to Public Law 600 by a majority of better than three to one.

Commonwealth Favored


It is expected that the supporters of commonwealth status will win on July 23. They have persuasive arguments—Puerto Rico receives, under the present "free association "

status," substantial financial assistance from the United States; it does not pay taxes to the United States Treasury; and it has free trade with the United States. On the other hand, those opposing the status quo argue that the referendum may only be an attempt by Luis Munoz-Marin and the Popular Democratic Party to rule out statehood and independence for all time. In addition, statehood advocates fear that Puerto Rico may move gradually from a commonwealth to independence. The volatile supporters of independence contend that the referendum is merely an attempt to kill independence and prevent them from taking their cause to the United Nations. Furthermore, many in the independence movement, particularly those influenced by communism, want to see all relationships between the United States and Puerto Rico-severed.


Movimiento Pro Independencia de Puerto Rico

maintains relations with the old Nationalist Party of Puerto Rico (NPPR), the terrorist group whose members attempted to assassinate President Truman in 1950 and, in 1954, fired into a session of the United States House of Representatives wounding five Congressmen. Current NPPR leaders are Jacinto Rivera Perez and Julio Pinto Gandia. In a speech delivered in October, 1966, Rivera appealed to Puerto Ricans to prepare to obtain independence by any means that might be necessary. Also in October, Pinto advocated armed revolt to obtain independence for Puerto Rico. In view of the many statements by militant supporters of independence that a plebiscite will bring civil war, the past history of terrorism on the part of the NPPR, and the communist connections of some of the militant organizations supporting independence, it is obvious that Puerto Rico may see difficult days in the weeks ahead.

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
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
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
INFORMATIVE NOTE 5/4/67

The San Juan Office previously furnished information indicating the possibility of a student riot during an open house being sponsored by the Reserve Officer Training Corps on the campus of the University of Puerto Rico 5/4/67. This information was furnished to all interested agencies.

As indicated in attached, a riotous situation did occur during this open house festivity. The information in attached was furnished by teletype to the White House, Secretary of State, Central Intelligence Agency, Defense Intelligence Agency, Department of Army, Department of Air Force and Secret Service. It will also be given to the Attorney General and the Office of Naval Intelligence.

They won't get it from the Puerto Ricans. But they'll try to embarrass us and discourage investments and keep people from working This plebiscite on Puerto Rico's future is set for July 23, which gives the network of interlocked "Marxist-Leninist" parties enough time to shake the coal fr L INFORMATION CONTAINED HEREIN IS UNCLASSIFIED the Commonwealth. Their target is obvious: Disrupt the people's vote on three propositions -- t retention of Commonwealth status; statehood; or an independent nation, which would have to be voted by the Congress here. Some of the network reaches into the mainland so there might well be some explosive sounds in some of the eastern megalopolises as far west as Chicago. Biggest of the so-called independence movements is one with a representative in Czechoslovakia at the Whiternational Union of Students. 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It also has a perminent representative at the Cuban headquarters of the Tricontinental Congress. This was set up in January 1966 to coordinate with what the revolutionists agilely refer to as "wars of liberation in Asia, Africa and Latin America."

This alleged independence movement has its allies. One is the Federation of University Students for Independence -- whose leaders have scurried as far as Mongolia (a costly trip) to participate in anti-U.S. global gatherings of students.

There is, too, the Puerto Rican Socialist League -- no relation to the American brand advocated for so many decades by Norman Thomas. It is led by Juan Corretjer who believes the traditional Communist Party has gotten too moldy. He teaches Marxism and Leninism. He champions Castro's Cuba. He is in close touch with the tiny cells of the New York based pro-Peking Progressive Labor Party, a violent group of young, young people who were right in the midst of the '64 Rarlem riots.

The party's chairman that year, William Epton, soon after was convicted of conspiring to riot and advocating criminal anarchy. After being sentenced to a year's imprisonment, he was released last Jan. 4. His was the first indictment in New York on criminal anarchy charges since 1919.

Senor Corretjer is both socially and politically close with the Independence
Party of Puerto Rico and with the explosive Nationalist Party of Puerto Rico. Some
will recall its raw terrorism and its members' efforts to kill President Truman.
Some will even recall how they did a wild West from the public balcony in the House
of Representatives here in '54 when they gunned down five Congressmen.

This by no means insimuates that all those for the independence of Puerto Rico are allied with the terrorists. The political scientists expect the island to move slowly from Commonwealth status to statehood. Nor does the trigger-happy network have much strength on the mainland. But they are neo-revolutionists. And that's where the action is.

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They can't stop the plebiscite. But they can embarrass such efforts as the cooperative venture of the Rockefellers' International Basic Economy Corp. (IBEC) and the proletarian, New York City-based International Ladies Garment Workers Union.

Under the leadership of the now bonorary president David Dubinsky and the current president Louis Stulberg, the union put up \$25 million in mortage money for the IBEC to build individual homes for some 2,000 families. So here is America today -- a union puts up millions for a billion dollar family subsidiary, so low-income Puerto Rican workers can be housed in their own homes amid gardens and modern plumbing.

No revolutionist can tolerate this. So they plan to make a mockery of the free elections to prove that the long arm of the U.S., its industry and its labor, is too short to protect them from the new "way out" radicalism.

It will be a short hot summer -- fireworks and all.

The May 11, 1967, issue of "Carta Semanal", self-described as the weekly newsletter of the Movimiento Pro Independencia de Puerto Rico (Puerto Rican Independence Movement) (MPIPR) contained the following information:

During the special meeting of the MPIPR National Mission held at Arecibo, Puerto Rico, on May 7, 1967, it was resolved that the MPIPR would hold a "National Congress Against the Plebiscite" at the Sixto Escobar Stadium in San Juan, Puerto Rico. This Congress is to be held on Sunday, July 16, 1967, one week prior to July 23, 1967, the date set for the Puerto Rico Plebiscite, to select a political status for Puerto Rico. The MPIPR's Congress on July 16, 1967, will be the culmination of the MPIPR campaign against this plebiscite.

During the May 7, 1967, meeting the MPIPR National Board also established minimum tasks to be accomplished in their campaign. The intent of this plan is that the missions throughout Puerto Rico develop carefully-planned activities within their areas, establishing work brigades which will hold meetings and "micro-meetings", develop neighborhood discussion groups, distribute publications, paste up posters against the plebiscite, and conduct similar activities. The missions were also urged to utilize local publications as well as other means of mass communication such as radio. In their work, the missions were instructed to attempt to link special local problems with the overall national purposes of the MPIPR.



According to the plans formulated, the work of the missions on the local level will be supplemented with material supplied by the MPIPR National Board and by leaders assigned to this work by the National Board. Six brigades, composed of members of the National Mission, will be named to talk at neighborhoold meetings called by the missions in the San Juan Metropolitan area. At the same time, eight brigades of four members each will travel on weekends to the various MPIPR zones in Puerto Rico to work with the missions on the local level.

To complement this work, a special printing of posters and handbills will be prepared concerning some of Puerto Rico's principal problems. In addition, during the weeks prior to the plebiscite special issues of the MPIPR official organ, "Claridad", will be printed.

In the matter of finances, it was decided that in order to help defray the cost of this campaign, a special collection would be taken by militant MPIFR members who will travel around Puerto Rico to ask people to contribute to the campaign against the plebiscite.


It was resolved that the MPIPR would conduct a radio program every evening at eight o'clock over Radio Station WPRA, Mayaguez, Puerto Rico. MPIPR leader JUAN MARI BRAS will be the speaker on the Thursday evening broadcasts. This radio program is to be a part of the MPIPR campaign against the plebiscite.

The May 19, 1967, edition of "El Mundo", a daily Spanish-language newspaper, contained an article on page 2 entitled, as translated from Spanish, "Group Plans Mass Repudiation of Plebiscite" This article stated in summary as follows:

A group of Fuerto Rican defenders of the political sovereignty of Puerto Rico announced that a concentration of forces to repudiate the plebiscite and to exhort Puerto Ricans not to vote in the forthcoming plebiscite would be held at the Sixto Escobar Stadium, San Juan, Puerto Rico, on Sunday, July 15, 1967, one week prior to the scheduled plebiscite.

The announcement was made Wednesday night at the Ateneo Puertorriqueno, San Juan, Puerto Rico, at a meeting attended by some two hundred persons who oppose the plebiscite and demand political sovereighty for Puerto Rico. .

It was also announced at the meeting that one-hundred and fifty Puerto Ricans had signed a document to be published later in the week which exhorted voters not to vote in the plebiscite on July 23, 1967, and demanded political sovereignty for the island. The one-hundred and fifty signers are University professors, political and labor leaders, students, writers, hankers, and other professional people.

Three committees were named at the meeting to have control of all the organization of the concentration of independentist force

to be held in San Juan, <u>Puerto Rico</u>, on July 16, 1967. The three committees are the Work, Publicity, and Finance Committees. The provisional committee which has charge of these activities is presided over by Dr. JOSE MILTON SOLTERO.

Among the speakers at this meeting were Dr. JOSE MILTON SOLTERO, AIDA NEGRON DE MONTILLA, Dr. MARGOT ARCE DE VAZUUEZ, Attorney NOED COLON MARTINEZ. Dr. GILBERTO CONCEPCION DE GRACIA, Engineer GERARDO NAVAS, Dr. PIRI FERNANDEZ DE LEWIS, and Attorney JUAN MARTIBRAS, all of whose speeches opposed the holding of the plebiscite on July 23, 1967. In addition, JUAN MARI BRAS stated in his speech that events of this meeting had "broken the isolation and dispersion" of the nucleus of forces fighting for Puerto Rico's independence and that thousands upon thousands of persons would come to Puerto Rico on July 16, 1967, to condemn the holding of this plebiscite.

The NPPR has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order - 10450.

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

With every word, Mari Bras, in his statements to the newspaper, substantiates everything the Director testified to during the Appropriations Hearing.







"El Dia", a Spanish language newspaper, published in Ponce, Puerto Rico, dated May 22, 1967, contained an article entitled "Mari Bras Reiterates That There Will Be Violence on the Day of the Plebiscite", which is synopsized as follows:

Attorney Juan Mari Bras, Secretary General of the Movimiento Pro-Independencia De Puerto Rico (Puerto Rican Independence Movement) (MPIPR), confirmed in a statement sent to 'El Dia' that there will be violence during the celebration of the plebiscite set for July 23, 1967. He discards the possibility of an armed insurrection here in the conventional sense or the type of guerrilla activity which occurs in other Latin American countries. In his statement Mari Bras attacks the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, John Edgar Hoover. 'To hell with Mr. Hoover, the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the imperialist government of the United States, we are not scared by their threats', says Mari Bras.

" Mari Bras also pointed out that the MPIPR has not asked for arms from the Cuban communist government, 'for guerrillas', but, 'it has asked for militant solidarity with our struggle, in all international forums to which Red Cuba has access.'

" In referring to the events which took place on May 4, 1967, at the University of Puerto Rico the leader of the MPIPR stated 'nobody should doubt that violent situations will take place.

"We had foreseen it, even before Mr.

Hoover said it, although we don't have a
counterintelligence system, nor do we think
we are prophets This reality is already
taking place at the University of Puerto Rico.
The provocation engendered by the plebiscite
emphasizes attitudes and positions. This
is the reason why a spontaneous student group,
on May 4, tried to stop an ROTC military
parade on the university athletic field.
The Federacion De Universitarios ProIndependencia (Federation of University
Students for Independence) (FUPI) leaders
did not stop the students and were very wise.' "

Mari Bras continued saying that "When these forces produce the massive protest of Puerto Rico against the abuse of colonialism on a national scale, we are not going to stop the people, we are going to help them achieve their goal. We want to produce that struggle, that is the struggle which Mr. Hoover, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and the Central Intelligence Agency, and all the imperialist machinery are afraid of."

Further on in the press release Mari Bras says that, "To conceal the fact that all the people are against them they say, as they have previously said, that the subversion originated in Havana, Moscow, and Peking We don't have to travel to any country to learn that the duty of every revolutionary is to revolt. We learned it from the father of the country, Ramon Emeteric Betances, who said it in concrete and native terms:

" 'To make scrambled eggs, you have to break the eggs. Scrambled eggs without broken eggs and revolution without revolt cannot take place.! "

Mari Bras continued, "But our revolution will be worked out according to our particular circumstances within the reality that our country is a fortress today, in every sense of American imperialism. To just talk of armed revolution herein the conventional sense or the guerrilla warfare conducted in other Latin American countries seems to be a necessity. This is only done by those who are content to fight the battles by arbitration."


Speaking of the situation which springs from the plebiscite campaign Mari Bras comments, "Hoover, head of the FBI knows very well that the plebiscite to take place in Puerto Rico on July 23, constitutes a provocation to our people. His blood hound agency as well as the rest of the repressive Yankee structure in our soil are terrified at the thought that the Puerto Ricans might unite to defend what is theirs. They have observed panic-striken the grouping process of the political powers of the country during the last few months, provoked by the announcement of a false plebiscite. While the government struggles intensely and the followers of annexation. devide itself in two, the patriotic fronts begin to unite in a large Puerto Rican, anti- colonialist and anti-plebiscitarian front. That front already achieved success with an historical action at the United Nations and as a result of which the false plebiscite was internationally opposed and the Puerto Rico problem is to be discussed in the future. Now the united front begins to take shape in the organization of a massive activity against the plebiscite to take place next July 16 in San Juan.



The MPIPR was organized in November, 1959, at Ponce, Puerto Rico, to work for the independence of Puerto Rico. It has an estimated membership of between 1,000 and 1,300 people with missions throughout the island of Puerto Rico and in New York, New York; Chicago, Illinois; and Buffalo, New York.

At the time the MFIPR was organized, it indicated that it did not advocate violence but would accept members who did. JUAN MARI BRAS, the founder and dominant leader of this organization, in a speech during March, 1964, threatened violence comparable to that in Algeria if Fuerto Rico became a state with the United States. A source reported in 1966 that a leader of the MPIPR has indicated that "the Revolution" would soon begin and another source advised that another official of this organization has attempted to obtain a number of automatic pistols.

Articles praising FIDEL CASTRO and the Cuban Government regularly appear in MPIPR publications. In 1961, it adopted a resolution expressing 100 per cent approval of and solidarity with the Cuban revolution. It sent a delegation to the Tri-Continental Conference of African, Asian, and Latin American people, held in Havana, Cuba, during January, 1966, and it maintains a permanent delegate to the Secretariat located in Havana.

The press of Puerto Rico has reported that the MPIPR has held numerous demonstrations protesting compulsory military service for Puerto Ricans and United States policy in Viet-Nam and the Dominican Republic.



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"WE ARE WARNED"

"The Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), J. Edgar Hoover, has just revealed that there is evidence that some separatist organizations of the island plan to create a wave of terror in connection with the coming plebiscite.

"Mr. Hoover made this declaration with all formality before the Appropriations Sub-Committee of the Federal House of Representatives. The creation of the form of government known as the Free Associated State, he explained, was surrounded with acts of extreme violence by the Nationalists in 1950. 'There is mounting evidence that renewed interest in the matter will cause a new wave of violence,' he stated to the Congressmen. 'The organizations that want independence for Puerto Rico have indicated that they will do everything possible to impede the plebiscite being held,' he added.

"The Director of the FBI mentioned among these organizations the Puerto Rican Independence Movement (MPIPR), Federation of University Students for Independence (FUPI), the Nationalist Party of Puerto Rico (NPPR) and the Puerto Rican Socialist League (LSP). He said that the four groups are under active investigation by the FBI.

"For the Puerto Ricans who have been living in recent months in a tense atmosphere, punctuated by clashes by the University students, acts of defiance towards the authorities, and protest demonstrations, the statement of Mr. Hoover does not produce great surprise.

"We are conscious that there are still some well intentioned persons who naively believe that the incidents which we have witnessed in past weeks are unconnected; the product of juvenile exhuberance. Others, not so well intentioned, only pretend to believe it and to convince the rest for their own convenience.

"Because of this we think it prudent to point up these statements of Mr. Hoover. We consider them of great importance because they come from a person of such high responsibility and because they have been stated officially before the highest legislative body of the nation.

"If the FBI says that it has proof that these acts

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of violence are planned, it is because it has the proof.

"It appears to us that particular attention should be paid to these statements by those persons who insist that the FUPI-one of the organizations mentioned by the Director of the FBI- is 'a group of irresponsible young men,' but concerning whose actions no great importance should be attached.

"We think it convenient to point out also amother of the facts mentioned by Mr. Hoover and openly confirmed sometime ago by members of the MPIPR. Cuba has offered the Nationalists of Puerto Rico money and arms to promote an armed uprising.

"And it should not be forgotten either that Russia, Communist China and Castro-Cuba have trained some of the leaders of these organizations.

"If these separatist organizations dare to put into practice their plans for violence, this would constitute a revolutionary attempt, an attempt that Puerto Rico is not disposed to tolerate.

"Here we have always resolved our political problems in peace and in order, as brothers. The island in the course of its history, has characterized itself by this peaceful and responsible attitude.

"On speaking in these terms, we refer of course to the great majority of the Puerto Ricans, because there have been minute groups disposed to use violence to accomplish their wants. The attitude of these small groups has been repudiated with firmness by the majority of the people, but it cannot be denied that they exist, that they are formed by fanatics and that they are capable of anything.

"If they resort to violence on this occasion, we have no doubt that the authorities will act in a rapid and effective form to deter them. The plebiscite must be held in peace and order. If there is an outbreak of violence, Puerto Rico has more than sufficient resources to suppress it. It would be better that it not occur."

PURPOSE:

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To set forth the latest information regarding the latest plans of independence organizations in Puerto Rico regarding the plebiscite which is to be held there on July 23, 1967. At that time the Puerto Rican people will express their preference for statehood, independence, or a continuance of the present commonwealth status.

DETAILS:

At a special meeting of the National Mission of the Movimiento Pro Independencia de Puerto Rico (MPIPR) the foremost Puerto Rican independence group, It was resolved that the MPIPR would hold a "Mational Congress Against the Plebiscite" at the stadium in San Juan, Puerto Rico, on Sunday, July 16, 1967. This will be the culmination of the MPIPR campaign against the plebiscite.

During the above mentioned meeting of the MPIPR National Mission, the following plans were made in connection with the MPIPR opposition to the plebiscite:

- 1. Militant MPIPR members will travel around Puerto Rico soliciting contributions to the MPIPR campaign against the plebiscite.
- 2. Work brigades will be established in MPIPR missions throughout Puerto Rico which will hold meetings. develop neighborhood discussion groups, distribute publications, and paste up posters against the plebiscite."

- 3. Six brigades, composed of members of the MPIPR National Mission, will talk at neighborhood meetings to be held in the San Juan metropolitan area. Eight brigades, composed of four members each, will travel on weekends to various areas in Puerto Rico to work with the local missions.
- Increased utilization will be made of publications and radio to publicize the MPIPR viewpoint.

In connection with the above mentioned data, the MPIPR and certain other independence organizations in Puerto Rico have banded together to repudiate the plebiscite and to exhort Puerto Ricans not to vote in the plebiscite. Reportedly, a document demanding public sovereignty for Puerto Rico has been drawn up which will be signed by 150 professional people such as professors, politicians, and writers.

The above mentioned data has been disseminated to interested agencies in San Juan and at the Seat of Government. San Juan has been instructed to closely follow all developments pertaining to the plebascite, particularly with regards to any planned violence and to keep the Bureau advised of developments on a continuing basis. This situation is being very closely followed at the Bureau and pertinent developments will be brought to your attention as they occur.

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

A carefully worded Bureau press release in the form of a "Message to the People of Puerto Rico" over the signature of the Director could be issued simultaneously to the Puerto Rican Spanish language newspapers at the time deemed most propitious by the Bureau. This message would emphasize the FBI's neutral position with regard to the Puerto Rican political scene but would point out the Bureau's responsibilities in the Internal Security field. Thereafter, the message would generally contain the following:

For several years, the FBI has been concerned with the extent of influence and control by Cuban communism, with its policy of exporting violent revolution to other Latin American countries, over a certain segment of the Puerto Rican independence movement. We have watched with concern the build-up of a highly efficient Cubantrained underground network in Puerto Rico, composed of "cells," members of each cell theoretically being unaware

All we are left with is Puerto Rican pride, the desire for unity in striving for independence and the ability to vote. The recent effort of cur leadership to boycott the voter registration laws was, as it always has been, a failure.

"We are no nearer to independence now than we were in Ponce in 1959, we are poorer and older, but we hope wiser. Wake up Puerto Rico, make use of the vote! "Grupo Pro Uso Voto Del MPI."

As has been done in the past, we propose to mail this leaflet from post offices in outlying areas to various representatives of the Puerto Rican independence community and also to select independence leaders not necessarily affiliated with any particular groups.

It is felt that this wording would result in no possibility of the reader misunderstanding the letter since it would fit in with the mention of attending cocktail parties sponsored by the Communists. However, it is also felt that it would not have the affect originally desired by the NYO of subtly undermining dignity.
- 2. As an alternative wording the NYO suggests that the wording in question be replaced by the phrase "he had attempted to ingratiate himself with them and catered to their typically North American opinions about Tuerto Rico." The NYO feels that this wording would present no problem regarding clarity and would tend to achieve the affect originally desired.

The NYO is of the opinion that the observation by the Bureau of the possibility that sympathy might be evoked by the phrase "dying for independence," is correct and that the phrase should be changed to read "struggle for independence".

The PIP was founded in 1948, but has declined in votes drastically since 1952. The purty first lost legal standing when it failed to poll the required five percent of the total vote east in the elections of 1960. The PIP was placed on the ballot by legislative edict for the 1964 elections, but again failed to poll the required number of votes. After being placed on the 1968 ballot by fulfilling all legal requirements for recognition as a political party by petition, the PIP received less that three percent of the total vote cast, again losing its status as a registered party.

On March 10, 1970, Mrs. ROSITA M. CORDOVA, Secretary to the Superintendent, Commonwealth of Puerto Rico Elections Board, advised that at the January 23, 1970, meeting of the Elections Board, whe PIP was certified as a legally constituted political party in Puerto Rico by reason of petition.

Ine January 25, 1970, edition of "The Sun Juan Star," an English language daily newspaper published at San Juan, Puerto Rice, reported that during his speech, accepting the presidency of the PIP, RUMEN BERRIOS MARTINEZ pledged himself to a more radical political posture, with "Christian socialism" and "pacific militance" as principal tactics. In an interview, BERRIOS placed special significance on the inclusion of other means of gaining independence in addition to going to the polls, such as more active participation in protests, marches, pickets and boycotts.

The Mebruary 24, 1970, edition of "The San Juan Star," reports that bERRIOS stated that "The only way to solve. . . the problem of military occupation in Puerto Rico is to achieve our independence as a nation."

The April 17, 1970, edition of "El Mundo," a Spanish language daily newspaper published at San Juan, Puerto Rico, contains parts of a speech given by skeRIOS wherein he says that the members of the organization are to intensify the struggle against the regime, but that violence was ruled out for his party. He added that it was more profitable for their cause to let the invaders break the heads of those opposing their oppression than to fight them face to face."
"Some day," he stated, "the lackeys of Yankee imperial-tum-wikings-too far and there will be innocent victims-and blood will run."

APPENDEX

MOVIMIENTO PRO-INDEPENDENCIA DE PUENTO RICO (PUENTO RICAN INDEPENDENCE MOVEMENT) (MPIPR)

The MPIPR was organized in November, 1959, at Ponce, Puerto Rico. It has a current membership of about 700-800 person. With several thousand sympathizers. The MPIPR is organized in missions which are located in various towns throughout Puerto Rico. There are also members and sympathizers in the continental United States. The MPIPR National Headquarters in located at 1122 Ponce de Leon Avenue, Rio Piedras, Puerto Rico.

At the time the MPIPR was organized, it indicated that it did not advocate violence but would accept members; who did. JUAN MARI BRAS, the founder and dominant leader of the organization, in a speech in 1964, threatened violence comparable to that in Algeria, 1964, if Puerto Rico became a state within the United States.

MARI BRAS, in an editorial appearing in the March 15, 1970, issue of "Claridad," the MPIPR newspaper, stated that "in Puerto Rico there is an incipient armed struggle on the part of pro-independence individuals who consider it their patriotic duty to conduct warfare against the empire which dominates us. We believe that every Puerto Rican has the right to make war against the invaders of our country. And war is mainly killing and dying."

The press of Puerto Rico has reported that the MPIPR has held numerous public meetings and demonstrations at which they protested compulsory military service for Puerto Ricans and United States policy in Vietnam. The MPIPR has further urged the boycott of elections in Puorto Rico.

On April 21, 1970, during the course of a program consumpt Television in San Juan, Puerto Rico, MARI SAAS stated that the MPIPR has innumerable contacts with revolutionary organizations in South America, Canada, Cuba, Europe, Africa and in Asia. Through 1969, the MPIPR had a permanent representative stationed in Havana, Cuba.

The counterintelligence letter which is the subject of referenced communications has had dramatic results which, upon analysis, indicate that the disruptive purpose of the letter is being acheived.

In the June 11, 1967, issue of "Claridad," the official organ of the MPIPR (the target organization), has written a lengthy article occasioned by the letter.

as the Bureau is aware, is the Secretary of Foreign Affairs of the MPIPR, a key figure of the San Juan Office and a delegate to the Tri Continental Conference, which was held in Havana, Cuba, in January, 1966. It is considered one of the most likely candidates to assume the mantel of power, if and when JUAN MARI BRAS, current MPI Secretary General, steps down.

In the article mentioned above, which captioned, "Another Committee of the C.I.A.," he warns the membership that the "Committee Against Foreign Domination of the Struggle for Independence" is the latest weapon of the notorious Central Intelligence Agency. labels the statements made in the letter "calumnies" and complains of its widespread distribution.

In an extended comment on past "C.I.A." tactics, reviews the history of the "Groupo Pro Uso Voto del MPI", an earlier counterintelligence device originated by the SJO. complains of how hundreds of persons associated with the MPI were bombarded with letters from the two Committees and how the letters changed in tone from mild policy statements to vicious attacks upon MPI leaders, in which the "Sinister" committees accused them of all manner of treason. Then assures the membership that dispite all this, the MPI electoral strike, which was the target of past letters, was a success. (As the Bureau is aware, the MPI suffered a serious defeat in its strike against the 1954 elections since the largest percentage of voters in the history of Puerto Rican elections was recorded that year.)

Turning to the letter in question takes each of the charges made in the letter and insists that they are not true, dwelling particularly on the alleged "secret meetings" with the CP, USA; control of the MPI by the CP, USA; alleged agreements between the CP, USA and MPI: and, a sellout by MPI leaders corrupted by the CP, USA. It is ends his comments in a series of invectives against the CIA.

Analysis of the Above

- l. It is the opinion of the NYO that the subject's letter has thoroughly disturbed MPI leadership. The usual tactic of the organization is to not respond to attacks by its adversaries, feeling that attacks which do not seriously affect the operations of the MPI are better ignored. It is unusual, to say the least, that the MPI would give space and extensive space at that, in its official organ for such a purpose. In addition, the fact that the MPI whose credentials are set forth above, would be chosen to write a refutation is significant.
- 2. Factors mentioned in refutation further indicate that the weight of the letters impact was strongly feet. Apropos of this is the admission by that "hundreds"

of MPI members have received counterintelligence letters, that is to say, that the coverage is wide spread and known to be so by MPI leadership. It is felt that references in refutation to character assasination show that the NYO's attempt to embarrass mentioned in the letter did not go unnoticed by the MPI.

- 3. At a time when revolution and violence is a distinct possibility in Puerto Rico, the creation of an impression that the CIA is operating in Puerto Rico against the MPI is a welcome result. The NYO is of the opinion that this impression may well act as a further deterent toward violence.
- 4. In summary, confusion has been created in the rank and file, and MPI leadership has had to counter with a refutation. The leadership itself, which is of course more sophisticated, has, nevertheless, made a serious analytical mistake about the origin of the counterintelligence letter and will be more cautious with operations as a result. The widespread effect of this measure and the overall counterintelligence program of San Juan and New York has thus been tactly admitted by the MPI. In addition, the security precautions taken by the SJO in preparing and mailing the letter have proven completely effective as evidenced by MPI leader's belief that the CIA is at the heart of the operation.

OBSERVATIONS:

It is believed that this cartoon will be of great assistance as a disruptive tactic in the Puerto Rican independence groups. This is most important at the present time since these groups are attempting to unite against a plebiscite which is to be held in Puerto Rico on 7/23/67. At that time the Puerto Rican people will vote for statehood, independence, or a continuation of the present commonwealth form of government.

The preparation of a suitable Red Chinese slogan such as "Down with Imperialism" has already been discussed with the Cryptanalysis-Translation Section of the Laboratory. The Exhibits Section should coordinate the preparation of the cartoon with the Cryptanalysis-Translation Section. Since the plebiscite is to be held on 7/23/67, it is believed most important that the cartoon be prepared as soon as possible to allow for mailing prior to the time of the plebiscite.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the preparation of the above-mentioned cartoon by the Exhibits Section be approved for mailing to members of the Puerto Rican independence groups in Puerto Rico or to persons sympathetic to these organizations. To recommend that we authorize our San Juan Office to mail an anonymous letter to members of the Movimiento Pro Independencia de Puerto Rico (MPIPR) in Puerto Rico and New York City. The MPIPR is a militant Puerto Rican Independence group.

BACKGROUND:

In May, 1967, we authorized San Juan to mail the MPIPR members an anonymous letter which pointed up apparent attempts by the Communist Party (CP) to interject itself into the Puerto Rican independence picture. In sending this letter it was indicated that it emanated from the "Committee Against Foreign Domination of the Fight for Independence," which is a fictitious organization. This anonymous letter served as a very good disruptive factor and caused an MPIPR official to write a lengthy article in the MPIPR publication attempting to refute it.

Our New York Office has now learned from an informant that the CP recently sent \$500 to the MPIPR in Puerto Rico through the New York Mission of the MPIPR. The New York Mission attempted to keep this contribution secret but was unsuccessful in so doing and apparently MPIPR members in

New York City learned of the action by the CP. A member of the Executive Board of the New York Mission was reportedly removed from her position on the Board because of statements she made regarding the CP donation.

The New York Office has now recommended the preparation of another letter by our San Juan Office which would be aimed at revealing the CP donation to MPIPR members in Puerto Rico and New York City. It is hoped that the letter will cause dissension within the MPIPR, embarrass the New York Mission for failing to keep the donation a secret, and embarrass the leader of the MPIPR by inferring that he is utilizing the money for his own use.

OBSERVATIONS:

It appears that New York's suggestion has definite merit and will be most useful to us in causing internal strife in the MPIPR.

RECOMMENDATION:

If you approve, the attached airtel will be directed to San Juan authorizing it to mail the letter under secure conditions to MPIPR members in Puerto Rico and New York City.







consideration is being given to mailing a copy of the proposed handbill to Radio Havana since they afforded radio publicity during the early stages of his case.

Should the Bureau approve this proposal it would require that the handbills be prepared at the Seat of Government to approximate as closely as possible the form, type and color of print of the enclosed handbill distributed by the Sixto Alvelo Committee during 1966. The last line on this handbill was purposely deleted since San Juan is not positive of the current mailing address being used by the Committee. To afford proper coverage 200 copies of the proposed handbill would have to be printed so as to provide 100 for New York and 100 for San Juan.

It is requested the Bureau give expeditious consideration to this proposal as mailing of the handbill by liew York and San Juan should be somewhat contemporaneous with a reclassification date.

Reportedly, a letter was sent by the IUPI Executive Committee to Mari Bras asking for an apology regarding his actions at the meeting.

You should give consideration to possible counterintelligence action regarding the above-mentioned matter if this can be done without jeopardizing your sources. Secure prior Bureau approval for any counterintelligence measure.
